Transforming Loss into Safer Workplaces

In September 2000, Cst. Petropoulos was investigating a break and enter complaint at a warehouse when he stepped through a false ceiling, fell nine feet into the lunchroom below and succumbed to brain injuries. There was no safety railing in place to warn him of the danger. The break and enter turned out to be a false alarm; there was no intruder in the building. John was 32.

So began Maryanne Pope's journey of coming to terms with her husband's death and working with the John Petropoulos Memorial Fund (JPMF) to raise public awareness about workplace safety for emergency services workers.

Maryanne's heartfelt and personal presentation is a powerful, candid and gripping account of the days leading up to John's fall, the circumstances that led to his death, and her experience of learning how to accept the unacceptable by transforming loss into positive change both through her writing and through the safety initiatives of the JPMF.
