



Understanding the role of medical consultants

Medical consultants are independent physicians contracted by WCB-Alberta to be medical resources to the claims process. They are licensed with a practice permit for independent practice in the province of Alberta.

Who makes decisions on your claim?

Your adjudicator or case manager is responsible for making decisions about your claim. They consider medical information, the Workers' Compensation Act and WCB policy to ensure you receive the right benefits and services at the right time.

How medical consultants assist your adjudicator or case manager

Medical consultants help by providing objective, evidence**based medical opinions**. They **do not** make claim decisions.

Medical consultants may:

- Review medical information and respond to questions from case managers and adjudicators about proposed treatment options for injured workers.
- Share their expert opinions on diagnoses, medical information, work-relatedness and fitness to work based on evidence.
- Liaise with treating physicians in the community to discuss the care and fitness of injured workers.

Medical consultants do not:

- Treat claimants or conduct clinical examinations.
- Order tests or investigations (e.g., blood tests, diagnostic imaging, etc.).
- Make claim decisions or manage claims.

To avoid conflicts of interest and maintain patient privacy and confidentiality, a medical consultant will not be involved in your claim if they have previously provided you with medical care.
